Labour Councillors get things done

Desborough had a proud tradition of electing people who worked hard on behalf of the town to get things done. Over the years Labour Councillors have been at the forefront in the fight to get our fair share of resources and the services we need for our community. Labour Councillors campaigned for a new Library, new Fire Station, a Nursery unit at Loatland School, all-weather playing surfaces at the Leisure Centre, parking provision for the bowling greens, new classrooms at Havelock Junior School and many other facilities for the town.

The Town Council was Labour controlled from 1978 to 2003. During this time Labour Councillors achieved the refurbishment of 'The Gaultney' to provide 10 self contained flats, the installation of a lift in Hazeland House, the Millennium Bridge to link the footpath between Desborough and Rothwell, the £11.5 million bypass which has taken a lot of heavy traffic out of the town, the refurbishment of Montsaye swimming pool, the introduction of CCTV cameras in the town centre and much more.

In contrast, the last eight years of Tory control, has seen little action, indecision, and the lack of an effective voice for the town. It's time to get things moving again!
