

PUBLIC SAFETY

Rothwell residents and traders wanted CCTV cameras in the town but the main problem was that the control room in Kettering simply wasn't big enough to accommodate the extra monitoring screens.

- New enlarged control room opened in April 2002.
- Home office funding (£225,000) for extension of CCTV to Rothwell, Desborough & Burton Latimer which went live in April 2002.

ROAD SAFETY

For many years Parents were concerned about the safety of children in School Lane due to the amount of traffic. One option was to encourage parents to park on the Market Hill and walk to the school but to do this they would need a pedestrian crossing (Carol Mullett organised the campaign and petition for the crossing). There were also concerns about safety in Greening Road and speeding traffic through the town.

- New crossing installed in the High Street through the governments 'Safe routes to School' initiative.
- Illuminated speed monitoring signs installed in the town.
- Traffic calming measures installed in Greening Road.
- New mini roundabout to slow traffic entering the town at Greening Road / old A6 junction.

ROTHWELL COMMUNITY CENTRE

In 1994 the Community Centre in Well Lane was in severe financial difficulty and the Community Association had been advised by an accountant that they were 'insolvent and trading illegally' (Evening Telegraph 7.5.1994). The building also had structural faults which needed urgent repair and the kitchens did not comply with environmental health requirements. The Labour led Borough Council stepped in and spent over £75,000 to upgrade facilities and keep the centre open.

- Kitchens upgraded to meet environmental health regulations.
- Structural faults repaired.
- Car park given a tarmac surface.
- Lighting installed in car park.
