Keep this card and take it to the polling station with you. It can make the issue of the poll paper speedier. If you lose your card it does not mean you lose your right to vote. Just go along to the polling station, give the presiding officer your name and address, and he will be able to give you a poll paper from this information.

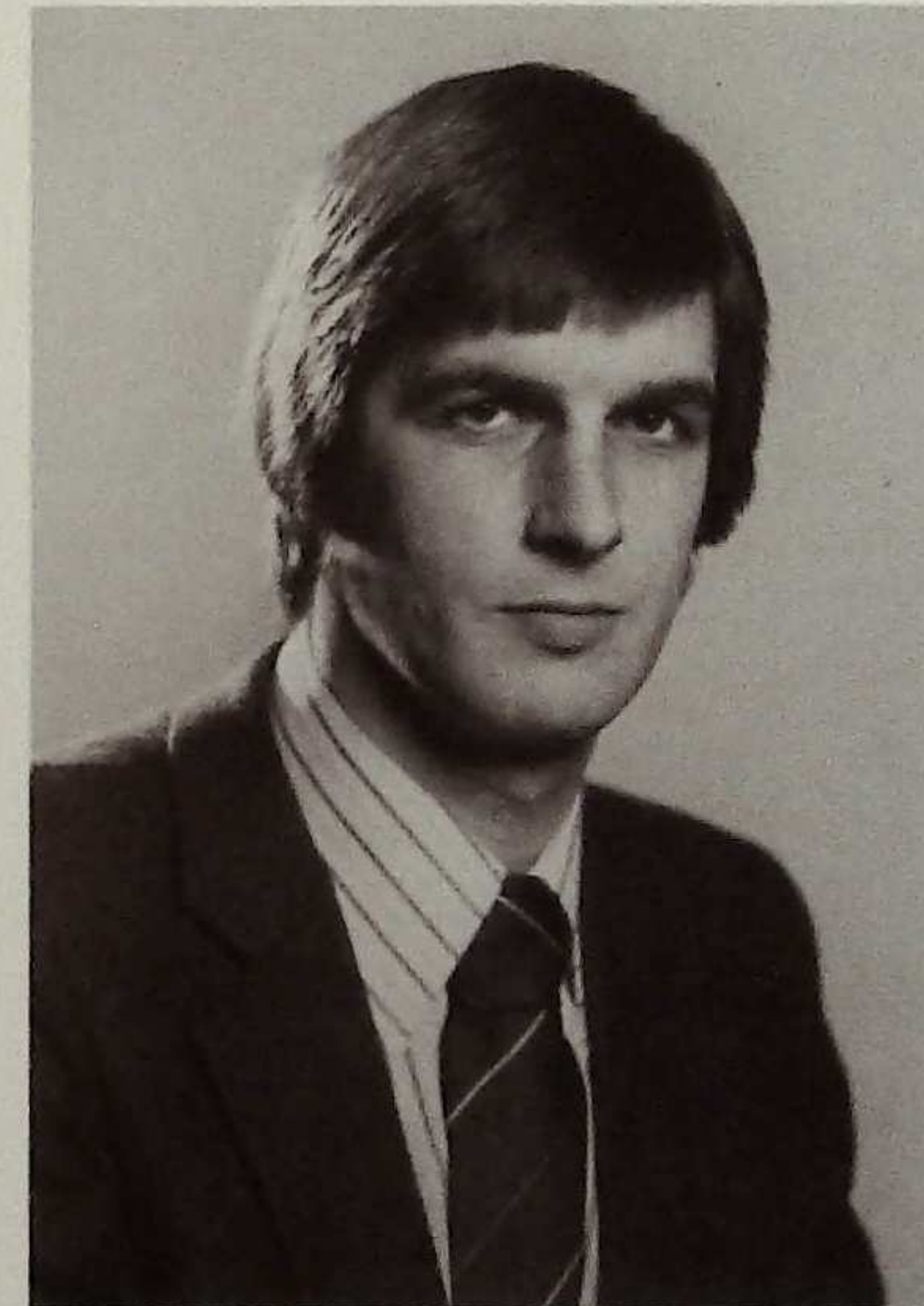

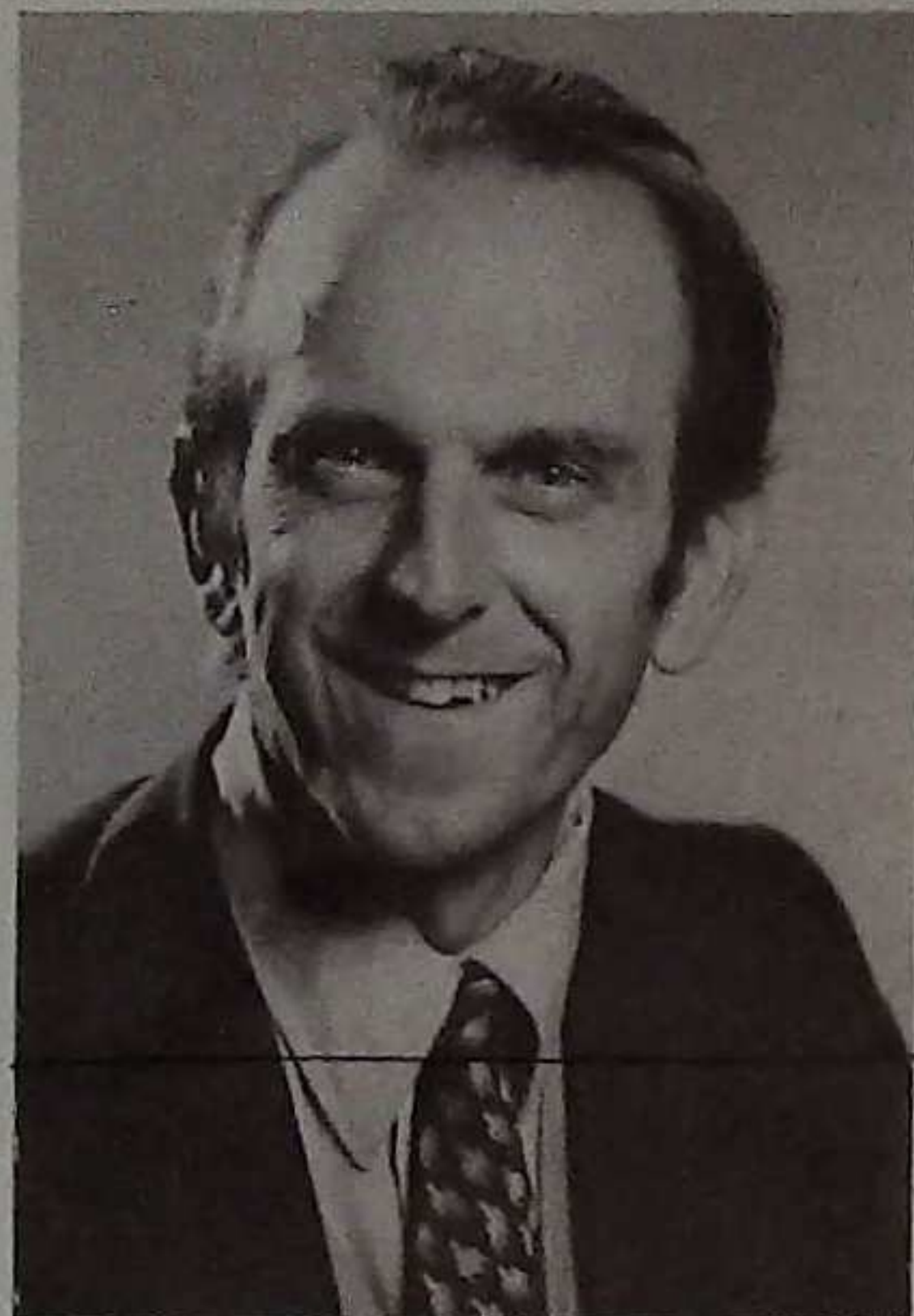
