Dear Voter,

I am gratified that Desborough Labour Party has given me the opportunity to contest the important election for a Town Councillor to be held on Thursday 27 October.

As a parent of young children it has caused me great concern that the Conservative controlled County Council is proposing to increase the speed limit on the busy A6 road from 30 m.p.h. to 40 m.p.h. and at the same time are considering the withdrawal of school crossing patrols. The safety of our children, and of all pedestrians, is one of my major concerns and I will fight these proposals with all the vigour at my command.
